## OFFICIAL RULES

## COVE CREEK CLASSIC

1. As soon as possible before the start of the tournament, each team shall submit: (a) a roster listing the names, birth dates and uniform numbers of all players; (b) copies of birth certificates of all players;
(3) names of coaches and team officials.
2. Teams must check in at the Tournament Headquarters at least one hour before the first scheduled game to review credentials. Once rosters have been checked in at Headquarters, they become official and additional players may not be added. If players are questionable for the tournament it is best to include them on the roster.
3. August $\mathbf{1}$ is the cutoff date for age eligibility.
4. Ice water and cups will be provided in each dugout for every game. No food, sunflower seeds, or tobacco products shall be permitted on the field or in the dugouts.

## PLEASE LEAVE THE DUGOUTS CLEAN!

5. Home Team will be determined by a coin flip for all games and the home team's scorebook will be considered the official book. A Tournament Official will assign batting cages. No infield will be allowed after any 10AM games played on Saturday and Sunday due to time restrictions.
6. Cove Creek has 6 fields and 13 batting cages. While a game is in progress, a participating team may not use a cage for batting practice. Subject to approval by Tournament Officials, a team preparing to play the next game may use a designated batting cage.
7. A protest must be made to the home plate umpire before the next pitch is thrown. A protest shall be decided immediately, and the game will proceed. A protest on a play, which involves an umpire's judgment shall not be allowed.
8. Appeals must be made to the umpire before the next pitch is thrown. Runners will not automatically be called out for leaving too early or missing a bag.
9. Players in the $9-10$ and 11-12 year old divisions who leave the base early without the pitch being hit shall be sent back to the previously occupied base. If a player leaves the base early and the ball is hit, the player is entitled to one base in front of the batter if they are not put out first.
10. Managers and coaches will be allowed to warm-up pitchers between innings. A second trip to the mound in the same inning by a coach or a third trip to the mound in a game will necessitate the removal of the pitcher.
11. Four innings shall constitute an official game. All tournament play is official. A game suspended before the completion of four innings shall be resumed at the point of interruption. If a game is suspended in any inning after the fourth, and the home team does not get to finish its at bat, then the final score shall be the score of the last completed inning. A game called for time shall be an official game regardless of the number of innings played.
12. Courtesy runners may be used for the pitcher and catcher at any time in the game.
13. No profane or abusive language will be tolerated by players, coaches or fans. Cove Creek Park is privately owned, and unruly fans may be asked to leave.
14. There is no mandatory play rule for each player in each game.

## 15. Substitution:

a. A starter may be substituted for at any time, and if upon re-entering the game, he/she must be placed in the same batting position he/she held upon starting.
b. A starter may not be in the game at the same time as his/her substitute.
c. Once a substitute leaves the game, he/she cannot re-enter unless it becomes necessary to prevent a forfeit.
16. A team may play if only 8 players are present and able to play, but not with 7 . If a team starts a game with only 9 players and one has to leave the game for any reason, the team may continue to play with 8 and the vacated batting line up spot shall not be considered an out.
17. A substitute once removed from a game can re-enter only if another player is injured and cannot continue. The opposing manager shall have the right to choose which substitute re-enters in place of the player who cannot continue.
18. No player shall throw a bat, helmet, glove, or any object to show frustration with or disapproval of a call made by an umpire. If so, the player shall be automatically ejected without warning. If ejected, the player must leave the field and dugout area, and shall be suspended for the next tournament game in which his/her team participates.
19. A manager, coach, scorekeeper or team official who is ejected shall also be suspended for the next tournament game in which his/her team participates.
20. All players must be in uniform with numbers on jerseys.
21. Only the on-deck batter is allowed out of the dugout. Only players, coaches, and one scorekeeper shall be allowed in the dugout and playing area.
22. An offensive player is not required to slide into any base or home plate. If a runner attempts to dislodge a ball held by the catcher or a fielder by (a) causing a collision, (b) throwing a elbow, forearm, fist, etc., (c) kicking, or (d) any flagrant act likely to cause injury, then the runner shall be called out and automatically ejected from the game.

For ages 9-12, no head-first sliding shall be allowed; however, a runner who has already gained a base and is attempting to return to it either because of a pickoff attempt or a run-down, may slide headfirst into the base.

For ages 13-15, head-first sliding is allowed.
23. Players ages 9-12 are not allowed to steal until the ball crosses the plate. Therefore there are no balks in these age groups.
24. No metal-cleated baseball shoes shall be worn by players 12 and under.
25. No designated hitters shall be used.

## 26. Pitching Rules:

a. A player may pitch up to six innings over any two consecutive games. There is no maximum number of pitching innings for the tournament.

EX. Player A pitches 6 innings in game 1. Player A may pitch 0 innings in game 2. Player A may then pitch 6 Innings in game 3 and 0 innings in game 4.
EX. Player A pitches 5 innings in game 1. Player A may pitch 1 inning in game 2. Player $A$ may then pitch 5 innings in game 3 and 1 inning in game 4.
EX. Player A pitches 4 innings in game 1. Player A may pitch 2 innings in game 2. Player A may then pitch 4 innings in game 3 and 2 innings in game 4.
EX. Player A may pitch 3 innings in every tournament game played.
b. One pitch to one batter constitutes an inning pitched.
c. A starting pitcher who is removed from the mound but remains in the game may return to the mound in the same game. A relief pitcher may not return to the mound after being removed. A starting pitcher who is removed from the game may not return to the mound, but may be reentered into the game as a defensive player.
27. Scorekeeping: Each teams scorekeeper is responsible for the following:
a. Collecting a game summary sheet from the Tournament Headquarters area before the start of each game.
b. Recording the number of pitching innings for each pitcher during the game and final score on the summary sheet.
c. Returning the summary sheet to the designated folder at Tournament Headquarters after the game is completed.
28. Game Length:
a. All games, in all age groups, shall be six innings. During pool play for age groups $9 \mathrm{U}-12 \mathrm{U}$, if the score is tied after six innings have been completed, the game will end in a tie. Tie games count $1 / 2$ a win. Tiebreakers in pool play are 1. Head to head 2. Runs allowed 3. Coin toss.
b. All games (including the championship) shall have a time limit of one hour and forty-five minutes. No inning shall begin after the expiration of one hour and forty-five minutes from the first pitch. The home plate umpire shall note the official starting time immediately prior to the first pitch.
c. If a team is leading by ten (10) or more runs after four innings have been played, or three-and-a-half innings if the home team has a lead of ten or more runs, the game shall be terminated. This rule will not be waived for the championship games.
29. Bat Requirements:
a. Ages 9 thru 12, no bat with a barrel diameter greater than $21 / 4$ inches will be allowed.
b. Age 13, no limitations.
c. Ages 14 and 15 , no bat with a weight to length differential greater than -3 shall be used.
d. Any player using an illegal bat will be called out.

## 30. Field Measurements

a. Ages 9 thru 12 play on fields with $60^{\prime}$ bases and $46^{\prime}$ pitching mound.
b. Ages 13 thru 15 play on fields with $90^{\prime}$ bases and $60^{\prime} 6$ " pitching mound.
31. All other rules will follow the National Federation of High School Rules.
